I, Mrs. Missouri Redwine, do hereby make application for a pension pursuant to the provisions of Articles 6204 to 6227, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 as amended by H. B. No. 150, passed by the Forty-second Legislature at its Regular Session and all other laws of this State relating thereto.

I am a widow of Joel Jacob Redwine, deceased, who departed this life on the 17th day of November, A. D. 1922, in the county of Young, in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband; (or in case of remarriage that I am now a widow); and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband

and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 15th day of July, A. D. 1889, in the county of Anderson, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said Joel Jacob Redwine, served as a Confederate soldier (or sailor) in the war between the States of the United States; or (that he was a soldier who, under special laws of the State of Texas during said war, served in organizations for the protection of the frontier against Indian raiders or Mexican marauders); or (that he was a soldier of the militia of the State of Texas who was in active service during said war). That my said husband served honorably from the date of his enlistment until the close of the war, (or until he was discharged or paroled in some military organization regularly mustered into the army or navy of the Confederate States until the surrender). He was honorably discharged or paroled at the end of the Civil War.

That I have been a bona fide resident of this State continuously since the 13th day of December, A. D. 1870.

Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service

14. To what race do you belong? White. 15. Were you living with Joel Jacob Redwine as his wife at the time of his death, and had you so lived with him for ten years prior to his death? ANS. We lived together from time of marriage till his death 33 years

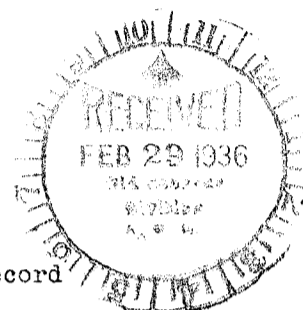

The records show that Jacob J. Redwine, also borne as J. Redwine, not found as Joel Jacob Redwine, private, Company E, 37th Regiment Texas Cavalry, (Terrell's Regiment, 34th Texas Cavalry), Confederate States Army, enlisted August 6, 1863, at Palestine.

The company muster roll for January and February, 1864, only on file, shows him absent sick at Camp Dixie since February 3, 1864. No later record of him has been found.

Please make answer to Question No. 15 and return the application to this office, and on receipt of a reply from Washington your right to a pension will have due consideration.

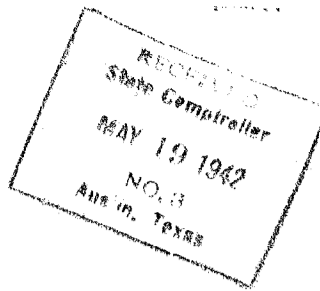

Dear Mr. Redwine:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 18, 1942 in which you state Joel Jacob Redwine drew a Confederate Pension.

I do not find any record of Joel Jacob Redwine drawing a pension, but I do find his widow, Mrs. Missouri Redwine of Palestine, Anderson County, Texas drew a Confederate Pension on his record under pension file number 51688, as Jacob J. Redwine.

Mrs. Missouri Redwine stated in her application for pension that Mr. Jacob J. Redwine's death occurred November 17, 1922 in Young County, Texas. The date of his birth is not given.

The application for pension of Mrs. Redwine was approved on a report furnished this office by the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C. This report stated Jacob J. Redwine was a private in Company E, 37th Regiment of Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, also known as Terrell's Regiment of 34th Texas Cavalry. He enlisted August 6, 1863, at Palestine, Texas. The exact date of his discharge is not given as he was reported absent sick at Camp Dixie since February 3, 1864. It is presumed he served until the close of the war in April, 1865.

The serial number of Mr. Redwine is not given.
