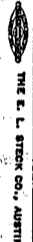

## Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Smith

I, Mrs. F.K. Ansley do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of J. (Jeremiah) Moore deceased, who departed this life on the day of February, A. D. 1865, in the county of \_\_\_\_\_ in the State of Georgia (around Savannah, Georgia in the late stages of the war.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,\* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, A. D. \_\_\_\_\_, in the county of \_\_\_\_\_ in the State of \_\_\_\_\_.

\*. Since the death of my husband I re-married W.T. Ansley, but I am now a widow. My husband, the said J. Moore, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 90 years of age.
2. Where were you born? Georgia
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? Twenty-One Years.
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? Twenty-One Years.
5. What is your postoffice address? Mt. Sylvan, Texas.
6. Did your husband draw a pension? No. If so, give his file number \_\_\_\_\_
7. What is your husband's full name? Jeremiah Moore.
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Georgia
9. How long did your husband serve? about three years If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge Enlisted May 1862, and was killed in action February 1865.
10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service, (If applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service.) Harrison's Georgia Infantry, finally known as the 32nd Regiment Georgia Infantry. He was under Captain John Lewis.
11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. He was an Infantryman. Later served as a Waggoner.

12. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as required by law.

I remember when Jerry (Jeremiah) Moore went to war. I am 81 years of age. He enlisted at Houston, Georgia. I do not remember the exact date.

My name is Mrs. F.K. Ansley, and I am now 90 years of age. I am the widow of Jeremiah Moore, also known as Jerry Moore, or J. Moore, deceased. My husband, the said Jerry, or Jeremiah Moore, was a Confederate soldier up to the date that he was killed in the war in February 1865 near Savannah, Georgia. I am now a widow at this time, though I am the widow of W.T. Ansley, deceased, whom I married after the death of my former husband, Jeremiah Moore. My husband, the said Jeremiah Moore, enlisted in the Confederate service in Georgia in the early part of 1862 and served in said army until his death. He never deserted the said service, but served honorably until his death in 1865, having been killed in action.

I have made diligent search for full evidence of the service of my said husband, but have not been able to get such other than here presented. I refer to the statement of A.J. Zorn and Mrs. Mollie Olive; and I also refer to a letter addressed to Will D. Pace, County Judge of Smith County Texas from Robert C. Davis, Adjutant General of the United States, substantiating his said service, all of which is made a part hereof.

I am legally entitled to receive a pension as the widow of the said Jeremiah Moore, deceased.



At the instance of Honorable Morgan G. Sanders, Representative in Congress, that you be furnished the Confederate record of Jeremiah Moore, who it is stated served as a member of Company I, 32nd Georgia Regiment, Captain John Lewis' Company of Infantry, you are informed as follows:

The name J. Moore (also borne as Jre. Moore) private, Company I (Capt. John F. Lewis), 57th Regiment (Harrison's) Georgia Infantry, subsequently known as the 32nd Regiment Georgia Infantry, appears on a bounty pay and receipt roll of that organization, which roll (not dated) shows him enlisted May 7, 1862, at Savannah, by Col. G. P. Harrison, for three years. The name J. Moore, private, Co. I, appears on returns of the above regiment for July and August, 1862, which show him, "on extra or daily duty as Waggoner." The returns for Sept., 1862, show him, "Absent sick at Georgia Hospital in Savannah," and the returns for October and November, 1862, show him, "Absent sick, received sick furlo for 20 days Oct. 27, 1862." No later record of him has been found.

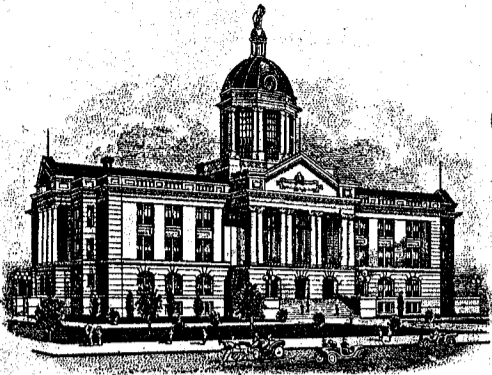
