Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Smith

I, Mrs. R. D. Clampitt do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of S. N. Clampitt deceased, who departed this life on the 19 day of June, A. D. 1929, in the county of Smith in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,\* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 10 day of October, A. D. 1879, in the county of Smith in the State of Texas

My husband, the said S. N. Clampitt, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 1. What is your age, and date of birth? 72 will be 73 on the 4th of Aug 1929/
2. Where were you born? Washington County Texas
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? All my life
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? 61 years
5. What is your postoffice address? Tyler Texas R. F. D. No. 7
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? No

If rejected, state when and where

- 7. Did your husband draw a pension? yes If so, give his file number 40375
8. What is your husband's full name? Sterling Nehemiah Clampitt

9. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? See his file

10. How long did your husband serve? see above If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge see above

11. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. (If applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service.) Which has been given herein above.

Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. See above

13. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located. None except a small home in Smith County Texas.

14. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings he had in the premises as required by law.

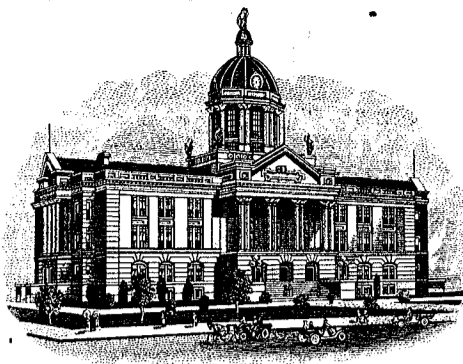
