Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Drofnich

I, Mrs. Salina C. Fox, do hereby make application for a pension pursuant to the provisions of Articles 6204 to 6227, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 as amended by H. B. No. 150, passed by the Forty-second Legislature at its Regular Session and all other laws of this State relating thereto.

I am a widow of M. A. Fox deceased, who departed this life on the 12th day of April, A. D. 1927, in the county of Drofnich, in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband; (or in case of remarriage that I am now a widow); and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband M. A. Fox

and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 27th day of May A. D. 1868 in the county of Murray, in the State of Tenn.

My husband, the said Matthew Anderson Fox, served as a Confederate soldier (or sailor) in the war between the States of the United States; or (that he was a soldier who, under special laws of the State of Texas during said war, served in organizations for the protection of the frontier against Indian raiders or Mexican marauders); or (that he was a soldier of the militia of the State of Tenn. who was in active service during said war.) That my said husband served honorably from the date of his enlistment until the close of the war, (or until he was discharged or paroled in some military organization regularly mustered into the army or navy of the Confederate States until the surrender). He was honorably discharged or paroled June 26 - 1865

The records show that Mathew A. Fox, private, Company C, 26th Regiment Tennessee Infantry (3 East Tenn. Vols), Confederate States Army, was enrolled June 27, 1861, age 17 years.

He was transferred to Company G, 63rd Regiment Tennessee Infantry, May 28, 1862.

Muster roll dated April 8, 1864, shows that he was transferred to Company B, 26th Regiment Tennessee Vols., November 30, 1862, but his name is not borne on the muster rolls of that company which cover in part the period from June 26, 1861, to August 31, 1864.

Muster roll of Company C, of that regiment, for May 1, to August 31, 1864, last roll on file, shows him present, a Corporal, promoted January 1, 1864.

Union prisoner of war records show that he was captured March 19, 1865, at Bentonville, arrived April 3, 1865, at Newbern, North Carolina, released June 26, 1865, at Point Lookout, Maryland, on taking the oath of allegiance to the United States.

His residence is shown as Cocke County, Tennessee, complexion light, hair light brown, eyes blue, height 5 feet 6 inches. (TX)

A statement in this case was furnished the Oklahoma Pension Commissioner July 13, 1915.
