that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any national, State, city or county office which pays me in salary or fees one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor have I any income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

4th interrogatory. If F. G. Gilleland and Felix Gilleland <sup>is</sup> are the same ~~parties~~, then I know him and know that he was in the Confederate service and performed the duties as a Confederate soldier.

5th interrogatory. Felix Gilleland belonged to Sam Easley's Company, and Bradford's Regiment. Some time during the latter part of the war, at Galveston, Texas. I was there four months and he was there all the time I was.

I have stated above. I saw him in the army, know he was a soldier and doing the duties as a soldier. I was in the same Co. and Regiment with him for four months at Galveston.

6th interrogatory. He was a private when I knew him, so far as I know.

7th interrogatory. I do not know. I knew him as a private for four months in the service.

CROSS INTERROGATORIES.

1st X Cross. I knew a Felix Gilleland in the army as above stated, and if his initials were F. G. Gilleland then he is the same man. I knew no other soldier in my company or in any other company of the same name. He is the only one I knew in the war any where. I can identify him as above stated, as Felix Gilleland. I knew no other.

2nd X cross. I am sure he is the same man, though I have not seen him in more than ten or twelve years. He knew me, knew I was in the army, and sent the interrogatories to me to answer, and I am satisfied he is the same man.

3 X cross. I do not know about his discharge. He was turned loose at Galveston just as I was, just as most all other soldiers ~~did~~ <sup>were</sup>, so far as I know or ever heard he served honorably from the date of his enlistment till he was turned loose. He was all right when I knew him.

4th Cross, so far as I know he never deserted. He was all right as a soldier when I knew him.
