I, Mrs. M. E. Haingrove do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of A. F. Coile deceased, who departed this life on the 18th day of March, A. D. 1894, in the county of Smith in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 21st day of January, A. D. 1861, in the county of Smith in the State of Texas

My husband, the said A. F. Coile, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$1000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 1. What is your age? 63, January 21st 1861
2. Where were you born? Smith Co. Tex
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? all my life
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? all my life, 816 S. Live oak, Del Rio
5. Did your husband draw a pension? If so, give his file number. No
6. What was your husband's full name? Amos Trouper Coile
7. What was the date of his death? March 18th 1894
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Georgia

9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge

10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service

12. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

My dear Mr. Sanders:

Referring to your personal request of April 7, 1924 for the Confederate military record of A. F. Cone, of Georgia, I have the honor to inform you as follows:

The records show that Aurelius F. Cone, of Georgia, was appointed 1st Lieutenant, Infantry, Confederate States Army, March 16, 1861; was appointed Major and Quartermaster, July 19, 1861 and received the temporary rank of Lieutenant Colonel April 2, 1863. He served as Quartermaster to General Holmes from July 19, 1861; was made Chief Q.M. to Major General G. W. Smith, August 30, 1862, and became A.A.Q.M. Gen. at Richmond, Va., December 10, 1863. He was appointed a member of a Board of Officers by Special Order dated February 17, 1865. No later record has been found.

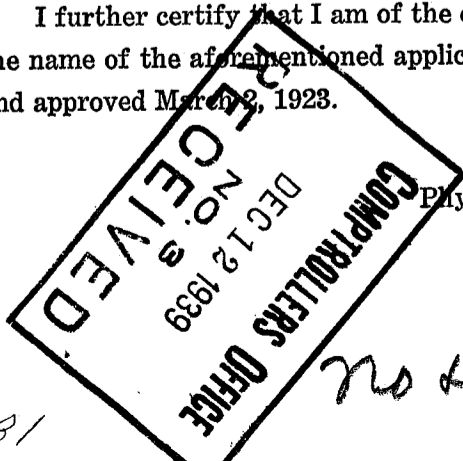
