Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,  
County of Smith,

I, Mrs. Mattie Hicks, do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of Adolphus L. Hicks, deceased, who departed this life on the 10 day of January, A. D. 1921, in the county of Smith, in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,\* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 10 day of January, A. D. 1889 in the county of Smith, in the State of Texas.\*

My husband, the said Adolphus L. Hicks, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 66 - will be 67 next birthday Sept 8.
2. Where were you born? in Smith County, Texas.
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? All my life.
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? All my life.
5. What is your postoffice address? Lindale, Texas, P. O. No. 3.
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? No.  
If rejected, state when and where.....v.
7. Did your husband draw a pension? No. If so, give his file number.....v.
8. What is your husband's full name? Adolphus L. Hicks.

9. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Texas.
10. How long did your husband serve? 1864 to close. If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge Do not know. Joined 1864 and served until close of War.

11. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service, (if applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service.) Co. "H" Capt. Jim Warren's Co. 44th Reg. Col. John C. Robertson Commanding.

12. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. Infantry (As I understand.)

13. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located. No.

14. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as required by law.

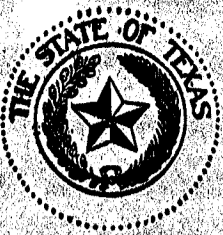

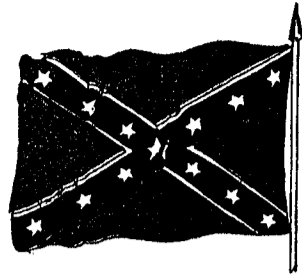

Your application for Confederate Pension has not been approved since the records in Washington fail to show any muster rolls of Co. H, 44th Texas Infantry, and the name of A.L.Hicks cannot be found on the muster roll of any organization, State of Texas, C.S.Army.


John C. Robertson was Lieutenant Colonel of the 37th Texas Cavalry, and James F. Warren was Captain of Co. H. same regiment, but there is no record of the service, capture or parole of A.L.Hicks as of that organization.
