United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty,
and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; that I was honorably discharged or surrendered at Mound Oranic Texas at the Close
of the war

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a

any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the
assessed value of over one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United
States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further state that

On the company roll for January and February, 1864, last on file, he is reported absent; detailed in quartermaster's department, Tyler, Texas, since April 10, 1863. No later record of him has been found.
